Claxby Parish Council Newsletter November 2024

Dear villager,

Councillors and volunteers have been very busy during the last few months and much has been achieved. Here is an update of the work completed together with some future plans. Thank you to everyone involved – there has been lots of very positive feedback from villagers, their families and funding providers.

Community Field

Volunteers spent many hours during the year clearing and removing overgrown vegetation and old unrepairable play equipment. Grants obtained from the National Lottery and West Lindsey District Council enabled the purchase of new and accessible play equipment and an accessible pathway. The installation was completed by Wicksteed contractors in mid August.

To celebrate this a "Picnic in the Park" event was held where young and old enjoyed trying out the new equipment, playing the village games and having refreshments including ice creams in the village hall.

A grant obtained from Lincolnshire Wold Grant Services also enabled volunteers to seed the reclaimed areas around the field, plant bulbs, create a wildflower area and install steps and a gate to the dog walking area.

Further work planned includes improvement to the pedestrian entrance to the play area, installation of new seating and accessible picnic tables, a new signage board and a nature area. Grants are being sought to cover the costs with, again, much of the work being carried out by volunteers.

The car park is currently opened for events in the Village Hall and Community Field and can be be booked by villagers or walking groups. It was also open during part of the school holidays to improve accessibility to the play area.

Wheelchair users, particularly, need access to the field via the car park and are currently limited when it is locked. Options to overcome this are:-

To leave the top gate open and lock the bottom gate.

To leave the top gate closed but unlocked and lock the bottom gate. These measures would allow access at all times to the play equipment and seating but would prevent vehicles being able to access the whole field.

To have a combination lock on the top gate with villagers having access to the code, again locking the bottom gate.

Villagers are invited to express their views or offer alternative suggestions to enable Council to decide on the best solution to ensure that everyone has appropriate access to the facilities.

Lincolnshire County Council Contractor Volunteers

We were again fortunate this year to have the offer of services from this group.

The old swings and slide in the playground and the fence and railings at the village hall were repainted. Membrane and gravel was laid between the hall and the neighbouring fence. Overgrown vegetation was cleared on St. Mary's Lane and the sign posts and bins around the village cleaned. It has been suggested that to keep the signs and bins clean and looking good, villagers, who are willing and able, may wish to "adopt a sign" and/or bin near their property and periodically clean it.

Footpath Mulberry Road

Work is planned to remove overgrown vegetation from the footpath from Bristow's corner to the telephone box along Mulberry Road to improve access. Council have appointed a contractor and the work is due to be carried out some time in November.

Village Hall
